NUNN MAN SENTENCED TO 36 YEARS TO LIFE

GREELEY, Colo. – Yesterday afternoon in Weld County District Court, Terry Evans (DOB 9/8/1973), of Nunn, was sentenced to 12 years in prison for Sexual Exploitation of a Child. A jury convicted Evans of the class four felony count on September 21, 2011. At the time of Evans' arrest on the 2011 case, he was serving an indeterminate probation sentence for a 2002 case in which he pled guilty to Sexual Assault on a Child by a Person in a Position of Trust, a class three felony. The judge resentenced Evans on the 2002 case to 24 years to life, to run consecutive to the 2011 sentence, making Evans' total prison sentence 36 years to life.

According to law enforcement reports, deputies with the Weld County Sheriff's Office were asked to assist probation officers with a home visit at Evans' residence on January 27, 2011.

During the home visit, probation officers located a laptop computer in the residence. Officers asked Evans if he was using the computer to view child pornography. Evans confirmed he had downloaded and saved multiple photographs and videos that he identified as child pornography. Evans then showed probation officers where those images were saved onto his computer. The officers found several thumbnail images which they enlarged and determined that the photos included children under the age of 18.

Probation Officers then asked Evans about video child pornography. Evans confirmed that he had such videos and again showed probation officers where those videos were located on the computer. Evans was arrested immediately.

Upon a forensic examination of the computer, law enforcement found 82 photographs of suspected child pornography and 12 videos.

On September 21, a jury convicted Evans of possessing at least one video of sexually exploitative material, commonly referred to as child pornography.

Deputy District Attorney Hollie Wilkinson represented the People of the State of Colorado in this case.
